AARON SCOTT

is a reporter at Oregon Public Broadcasting in Portland, where he produces *State of Wonder*. At the Residency, Aaron will be working on a story about the legacy of one family's photo album, found on the bombed-out beaches of Okinawa during World War II.

ADIZAH EGHAN

is a radio producer at *Snap Judgment* in Oakland, and a San Jose native. Adizah will use the Residency to work on an audio documentary entitled *The day of...* following a family in the Bay Area as they prepare for a loved one's parole hearing and potential return home.

CHER VINCENT

is an audio producer in Chicago, where she is the executive producer/co-founder of the podcast network Postloudness. During the Residency, Cher will be editing the pilot episode of It's All Relative, a six-part series about intricate webs of siblings, particularly within the brown community.

JARED MARCELLE

is a radio producer at *Radio Rookies*, a recent graduate of Brooklyn College and a Brooklyn native. Jared will use the Residency to work on a story following one of the first teenagers selected for the Close To Home Initiative, a New York City program that gives those in juvenile detention the chance to live in small facilities throughout the city, instead of going upstate.

JASMIN LOPEZ

is an independent radio producer based in New Orleans who works in the U.S. and Mexico. At the Residency, Jasmin will be working on *Silent Beauty*, an experimental audio narrative about her family's history with child sexual abuse and a culture of silence.

JIMMY GUTIERREZ

is a radio producer at New Hampshire Public Radio, who was born-and-raised in Milwaukee. Jimmy will use the Residency to work on a project exploring how individual lives are affected by New Hampshire's Operation Granite Hammer, the state's response to the opioid epidemic.

RUXANDRA GUIDI

has been telling stories throughout the Western Hemisphere in print and radio for the past 15 years. During the Residency, Ruxandra will take a personal look at what has happened to Venezuela's "21st-Century Revolution" over the last two decades - roughly as long as she's been living outside her home country.

SHARON MASHIHI

is based in Brooklyn, where she creates movies, radio and performances. At the Residency, Sharon will be working on a story about her Iranian mother, who never believed in the benefits of therapy - until her life was changed by a Farsi call-in show hosted by an Iranian psychologist.

SYEDA HASAN

is a public radio reporter for KUT News in Austin. She's a first-generation American, Muslim and proud Texan. During the Residency, Syeda will be following the story of a mixed-status family, separated by the U.S. immigration system.
